“Word For Word”

The seminar is divided into two main parts:

- In the first part, the participants will gain basic knowledge about : a. the benefits of using poetry in the teaching of language, b. the criteria for selecting poems suitable for the language classroom, c. the management of any issues that may arise when using poems in the classroom.
- In the second part, the participants will follow step by step the designing of a lesson plan based on a poem by the poet Nikos Engonopoulos.
